d) Traffic & Parking at Pick-Up/Drop-Off

Rangers been around, need to be safe, cars will be booked. Not only about the fine but it's mostly about the safety of kids. Be respectful of neighbours. P&C (Jodie) has put a quick FAQ together about pickup and drop off – refer to FAQ document for more detail.

- Kiss & go, wait in line until you reach the first 3 bays. Wait until you're up the front and ensure children are ready to get out.



- Kiss and go in the afternoon – rangers are around warning parents. Some rude behaviour has been observed but they are just going their job. The pick up system is usually completed in 20 mins. If you have a senior student you can get your senior sibling to pick up your younger child and you can meet them at a safe place. Easier and simpler and will make a difference to others.
 - AM – Kiss and go, don't get out of the car or call out to your child. Need to get the message out. Small minority. Need to get out to community of parents/carers. Don't push in line. Maintain distance. Generally speaking everyone doing well.
 - There is a need to reinforce the need for social distancing from adults in pick-up line.

Item 6: Your children are focused and learning - back to normal school routines. The playground is a buzz and they are enjoying being back with their friends.

Item 7: During this time teachers are analysing where your child is ‘at’ in their learning so that they can focus on what teaching and learning programs can be put into place to drive their learning forward. Whilst this is happening they are also collecting data in preparation for reports due at the end of this Term. We will be having Zoom teacher conferences early in Term 3 so that you can get a closer picture of your child’s learning progress. APPENDIX D - SCCS (OOSH/SCLC) Update:

Message from Jack Roach – OOSH Director

“OOSH numbers are slowly but steadily increasing as term two continues towards its conclusion. It’s so hard to believe we’re already in week 7! Here at the Centre we’ve been reaching about 60-70% of our attendance capacity over the last few weeks, which is really encouraging to see.

The Government’s subsidisation of fees as well as their Jobkeeper payment scheme has ensured that the Centre has remained financially stable throughout this tough time. With both these initiatives concluding in July, OOSH will once again be returning to it's regular fee structure from that point forward.

In relation to the Pandemic, OOSH has kept up the already significantly increased cleaning practices throughout the Service. Food serving safety and handwashing have also been a major focus throughout the Centre in order to keep the children as safe as possible.

Winter Vacation Care will soon be upon us and the Centre is excited about the diverse and engaging nature of the program that will be released to families on Monday next week (June 15th).
